There was a legal and regular session of the City Council of the City of Monroe, Louisiana held on this date at the Council's regular meeting place, the Council Chamber, City Hall Building, Monroe, Louisiana.

The Honorable Chairman Ezernack, called the meeting to order. She then asked the clerk to call roll.

There were present: Mr. Harvey, Mrs. Ezernack, & Mrs. Dawson

There was absent: Ms. Woods & Mr. Marshall

Chairman Ezernack announced that a quorum was present, and that the Invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance would be led by Mr. Harvey or his designee.

The Invocation was led by Assistant Pastor Rachel Washington, Greater Faith Church.

COMMUNICATIONS & SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Mr. Harvey had no announcements.

Mrs. Dawson said Happy New Year and thanked everyone for attending the City Council meeting.

Mrs. Ezernack welcomed everyone to the City Council's first meeting of 2024. She reminded everyone this is the year of kindness, caring, and peace and she said to remember that in our daily lives.

Upon motion of Mr. Harvey, seconded by Mrs. Dawson the minutes of the Legal and Regular Session of December 27, 2023, were unanimously approved. (There were no public comments.)

PROPOSED CONDEMNATIONS:

The following condemnations were considered:

1. 208 Egan Street (D4) (Owner – Carrie Mae Jones) Notice to show cause was served. Photographic evidence was presented. There was no one present. Upon motion of Mr. Harvey, seconded by Mrs. Dawson and unanimously approved, the building was condemned, and the property owner was given 30 days in which to bring the structure into compliance with the Code or demolish the Structure and clean the lot. (There were no public comments.)

Mr. Brandon Creekbaum, City Attorney, noted for the record all the proposed condemnations on the agenda are curator services.

Mr. Tommy James, Code Enforcement Officer, stated this is a burnt dilapidated structure and it burnt 2022. They are asking that the property be condemned, giving the owner 30 days.

2. 508 South 1st Street (D4) (Owner – Benny Ray Sims) Notice to show cause was served. Photographic evidence was presented. There was no one present. Upon motion of Mr. Harvey, seconded by Mrs. Dawson and unanimously approved, the building was condemned, and the property owner was given 30 days in which to bring the structure into compliance with the Code or demolish the Structure and clean the lot. (There were no public comments.)

Mr. James stated this is an open dilapidated unsafe structure and they are asking that the property be condemned, giving the owner 30 days.

The following condemnation was removed:

3. 104 Jason Drive (D5) (Owner – Huey Mathis and Lorthel Pratt) Upon motion of Mr. Harvey, seconded by Mrs. Dawson and unanimously approved to remove this item from the agenda. (There were no public comments.)

4. 207 Egan Street (D4) (Owner – Emma Fay Abraugh c/o Antony C. Johnson) Notice to show cause was served. Photographic evidence was presented. There was no one present. Upon motion of Mr. Harvey, seconded by Mrs. Dawson and unanimously approved, the building was condemned, and the property owner was given 30 days in which to bring the structure into

compliance with the Code or demolish the Structure and clean the lot. (There were no public comments.)

Mr. Tommy James, Code Enforcement Officer, stated this is a burnt dilapidated structure and they are asking that the property be condemned, giving the owner 30 days.

5. 505 South 25th Street (D3) (Owner – Gator Realty, LLC and Donald D. Lewis) Notice to show cause was served. Photographic evidence was presented. There was no one present. Upon motion of Mr. Harvey, seconded by Mrs. Dawson and unanimously approved, the building was condemned, and the property owner was given 30 days in which to bring the structure into compliance with the Code or demolish the Structure and clean the lot. (There were no public comments.)

Mr. James stated this is an open dilapidated structure and they are asking that the property be condemned, giving the owner 30 days.

There being no objection from the Council and before moving to the next item on the agenda Mayor Friday Ellis noted a lot of great announcements are happening in the City. He said the I-20 passenger rail announcement was to note that the City of Monroe have been selected for the Corridor Identification and Development Program. He said this is the first step of multiple steps to bring passenger rail service to the City. He said the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) website and Amtrak website have been updated and Interstate 20 is on the map now. He thanked the team and their creative grant writing that allow artists within the City of Monroe to start beautifying the City's recreation centers and basketball courts. He said the Black Creative Circle got together outside of Powell Recreation Center and did a mural. He noted the next mural is for Charles Johnson park, and they hope to continue this throughout the City. He said eventually all the City basketball courts will be painted and the artists that were a part of this also got paid, which is an opportunity for them to earn money as they do this as well. He further noted the annual bike give away is always fun and it's nice to run into kids every year that tell you, they received a bike from the City of Monroe. On another note, Mayor Ellis stated a lot of the work done in the City that residents can't see because all of it is underground such as the Texas Stanifer trunk line. He stated this was a 42 inch service main that was clogged about 9000 feet, and it has been that way for years. He said it is a massive undertaking and it keeps sewers from backing up in residents homes. Lastly, the Mayor announced the City of Monroe 45th Annual Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Birthday Salute Tuesday, January 16th at the Jack Howard and he said this year the City has a keynote speaker (Ms. Zebie Grayson). He said it's a wonderful program to be able to honor those in the community that are making a difference and leave a lasting impact on families and a lasting legacy within the City. He said if you can please be in attendance with the City to honor those who honor our residents every single day.

Mrs. Ezernack announced the City Council next meeting will be on January 22, 2024, on a Monday night at 6:00 pm. She noted the City Council will be traveling on the regular Council meeting day to Washington, D.C. to talk about rail and other projects that the City would like to have additional funding for and make people aware of. She further noted the change will be posted on the City's website as well.

CITIZENS PARTICIPATION:

1. Ms. Keisha Sparks, 607 North 3rd Street, said Happy New Year to everyone and she said at the beginning of the new year if any citizen wanted to make a career change Acadian has an earn as you learn program still available. She stated the next Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) program will be February 5 and they are interviewing for that now. She further stated it is a paid two week course and you will receive an EMR state certification. She said it will encourage you to go as far as you want in the medical field.

Mrs. Dawson wanted to clarify that the start date is February 5th.

Ms. Sparks said yes, and she said you earn during orientation and during class. She said they provide books and all of the schooling.

Mrs. Dawson wanted to know where does one go to apply.

Ms. Sparks stated the Acadian Ambulance website.

2. Mr. Michael Caster, 3408 Garden Avenue, said this week he was accused of something that happen at a recreation center. He said people were making copies of papers and he noted he had nothing to do with that, but he was attacked for it. He said he feel like if he is going to be put in it, he in it and he said it is not fair for no one to be running for candidate and you can get free stuff

done inside the City. He said for years people in Monroe have done stuff wrong for so long in this City that they think it's right.

3. Ms. Johnnie Thomas, 414 South 8th, said she was late, and she had a reason to be late because for the first time in 77 years of her life the City now have crossing rails at that railroad track. She stated they were installed on Saturday, and she said she knows it was because of the accident but the community is glad to have them.

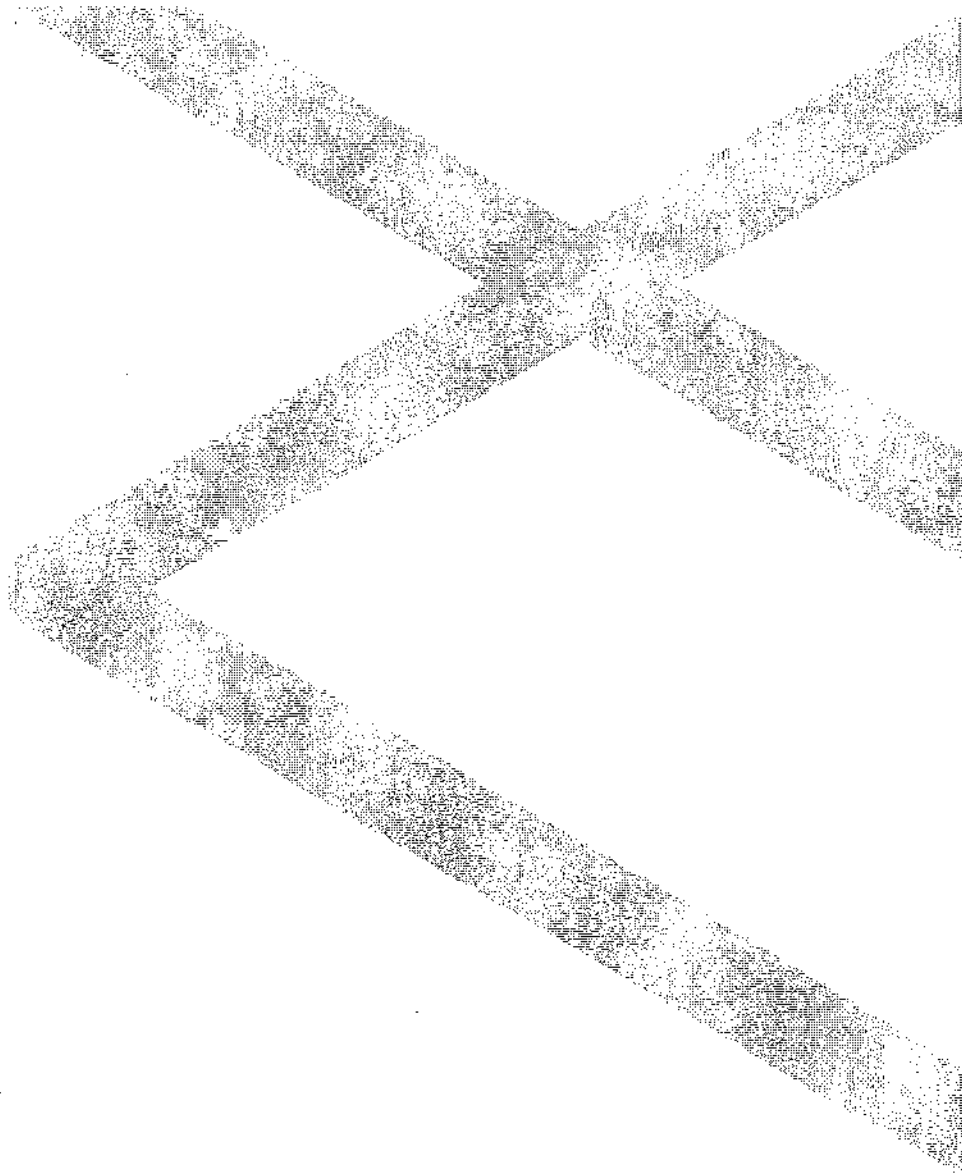

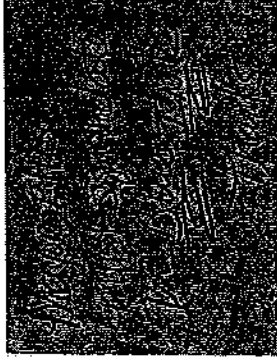

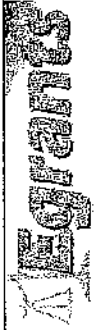

1. **CIVIL RIGHTS REQUIREMENTS.** Recipients of funds must comply with any applicable nondiscrimination requirements, which may include the Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975; the Department of Justice Non-Discrimination Regulations at 28 C.F.R. Part 42, Subparts C, D, G, and I; 28 C.F.R. Part 35; and 28 C.F.R. Part 54.

2. **COMPLIANCE WITH POLICY.** The Applicant Agency assures that it will comply with all Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement Policies and the State D.A.R.E. Advisory Board Policies (1-20 below).

A. The D.A.R.E. CORE curriculum is to be taught in the exit grade of the elementary school, 5th or 6th grade depending on which is the exit grade. The officer is to be allowed to conduct as many K-4 visitation lessons as time possible. The D.A.R.E. officer must have a clean record, a minimum of two years street experience, mature, possess good communication and organization skills, and must be a sworn, full-time Level 1, Basic P.O.S.T. Certified (320 hours) law enforcement officer.

B. The certified D.A.R.E. Officer will teach in at least one elementary school for at least one school semester. The certified D.A.R.E. officer will begin teaching in the school semester that immediately follows the training.

C. A member(s) of the Louisiana D.A.R.E. Training Staff will encourage, advise and monitor the D.A.R.E. officer in his or her delivery of the D.A.R.E. curriculum. The officer will be observed on a regular basis by a certified trainer or certified educator.

D. The D.A.R.E. officer will teach no more than four (4) CORE lessons per day and, if possible, the officer should teach no more than four (4) days a week allowing one day to be spent preparing for the next week. The D.A.R.E. officer is to be at each school one full day in uniform. The officer should arrive at the school when the other teachers do and leave after the buses have left. The officer is to eat lunch with and have at least one (1) P.E. or Recess class with the exit grade class.

a. The Junior High D.A.R.E. Officer should teach no more than six lessons a day. The requirement of spending a full day at each school will not apply to the Junior High Curriculum. Multiple schools can be taught on the same day if logistics permit.

b. The Senior High D.A.R.E. Officer should teach no more than six lessons a day. The requirement of spending a full day at each school will not apply to the Senior High Curriculum. Multiple schools can be taught on the same day if logistics permit.

E. The D.A.R.E. class size will be no more than 33 students per 45 -- 60-minute class.

F. A designated representative from each law enforcement agency and school system must agree to the policy and procedures of the D.A.R.E. project in order to participate in D.A.R.E. by signing the Letter of Agreement.

G. All law enforcement departments will submit the name of the D.O.T. officer candidates to the State Training Center prior to the start of the training seminar. The officer must first be approved by the school system, interviewed by the D.A.R.E. training staff, and approved by the State D.A.R.E. Advisory Board. The officer must meet minimum qualification requirements as set out by the State D.A.R.E. Advisory Board.

H. A principal's meeting will be conducted by a member(s) of the D.A.R.E. training staff prior to the training of the officer in the jurisdictions that have not implemented the D.A.R.E. program.

I. The officer attending the D.A.R.E. Officer Training seminar shall miss no class time and remain at the training site overnight.

J. The D.A.R.E. officer will adhere to a dress code while teaching in the schools. All D.A.R.E. officers will be in uniform while on school campuses. Officers may bear arms while in the classroom at the option of the local D.A.R.E. program manager (Sheriff, Chief, education system).

K. The trained D.A.R.E. officer will conduct a teacher orientation following the training. The teacher orientation will be mandatory for teachers who will have the D.A.R.E. officer teaching the core curriculum in their classroom.

L. The classroom teacher is required to remain in the classroom while the D.A.R.E. officer is teaching.

M. The D.A.R.E. officer is to be identified only as the D.A.R.E. Officer.

N. The D.A.R.E. Officer will attend 12 hours of in-service training during the calendar year (January 1 – December 31) as sanctioned by the Louisiana D.A.R.E. Training Center. Failure to comply shall result in the officer certification being revoked.

O. Any officer who has been inactive as a classroom instructor/trainer for two years or more must be re-certified by successfully completing the appropriate training (D.O.T./M.O.T.). All curriculum manuals will be returned to the Louisiana D.A.R.E. Training Center if the officer's certification expires or they leave the D.A.R.E. program.

P. No changes in the D.A.R.E. curriculum can be made without approval from D.A.R.E. America.

Q. Failure to follow program guidelines could result in the revocation of an officer's D.A.R.E. certification.

- R. Elementary core classes (5th and 6th grade) are not to be sacrificed to implement D.A.R.E., Junior High, Senior High, Parent or any other D.A.R.E. curriculum program.
- S. All officers for D.A.R.E. training (Elementary/Junior High/Senior High/Parent and other D.A.R.E. Training) will attend in-state training if available. All requests for training (in- or out-of-state) must be submitted in writing to the Louisiana D.A.R.E. Training Center at least 45 days prior to requested training event.
- T. All officers are required to maintain their D.A.R.E. certification by attending in-service training to update any D.A.R.E. curriculum (Elementary, Junior High, Senior High, Parent or any other D.A.R.E. program). The in-service will be provided in state by the Louisiana D.A.R.E. Training Center.
3. **D.A.R.E. SCHEDULE.** The applicant assures that all D.A.R.E. Officers' Teaching schedules will be submitted to the State D.A.R.E. Training Center no later than the fifth (5th) lesson of the D.A.R.E. curriculum is taught. If schedules are received after the fifth (5th) lesson of the D.A.R.E. curriculum is taught, the agency forfeits their funding for that semester.
4. **D.A.R.E. SIGNED AGREEMENT.** The applicant assures that a current, signed D.A.R.E. agreement between the applicant Law Enforcement Agency, Parish School Board Superintendent, Louisiana D.A.R.E. Training Center and the Louisiana D.A.R.E. Advisory Board is on file with the Louisiana D.A.R.E. Training Center and available upon request to the Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement.
5. **DISCRIMINATION FINDING.** The applicant assures that in the event that any federal or state court or administrative agency makes a finding of discrimination after a due process hearing on the grounds of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age, or disability against a recipient of funds, the recipient will forward a copy of such findings to the Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement, PO Box 3133, Baton Rouge, LA 70821-3133 and Office for Civil Rights, Office of Justice Programs, U.S. Department of Justice, 810 7th St., N.W., Washington, D.C. 20531. The State of Louisiana also includes any discrimination on the grounds of sexual orientation.
6. **EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM.** The applicant assures that if required to formulate an Equal Employment Opportunity Program (EEOP) in accordance with 28 C.F.R. 42.302 et seq., compliance with the requirement will follow, and a current EEOP will be maintained on file or submitted to the Office for Civil Rights, Office of Justice Programs, U.S. Department of Justice according to applicable requirements. If claiming a partial or complete exemption from the EEOP requirements, the applicant will submit a copy of the enclosed EEOP Certification Form to the Office for Civil Rights.

8. **FUTURE SUPPORT.** The applicant understands that Award of future year funds is contingent upon the availability of future State appropriations.
9. **IMPLEMENTATION OF GRANT.** The grant must be operational within (30) thirty days of the Start Date of the grant. If the officers are unable to begin teaching within the 30-day window a Sub-grant Adjustment must be submitted to change the start date and adjust the budget.
10. **INSPECTION AND AUDIT.** The applicant assures that it will maintain adequate records on time and attendance, supply purchases, etc. to support an audit of the D.A.R.E. Program, LCLE and/or the Louisiana Legislative Auditor shall have such access to records for the purpose of examination and audit.
11. **OBLIGATION PERIOD.** State General funds for the D.A.R.E. Program are effective from July 1 to June 30 of the current State fiscal year. Funds can be used to cover D.A.R.E. expenses only during this project period and may not be obligated prior to July 1, or after May 31 of the current State fiscal year. All supplies purchased from grant funds must be delivered to the sub-grantees on or before May 31 of the current State fiscal year. In accordance with State Purchasing Regulations, The Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement must receive final requests for funds from sub-grantees no later than June 15 of the current State fiscal year to ensure that the State Division of Administration can process all payments prior to State fiscal year closeout.
12. **PERSONNEL.** The applicant assures that rates for salaries and fringe for D.A.R.E. officers are consistent with the Applicant Agency's Departmental Policies. The Applicant also assures that salaries from the grant will be for base pay, not supplemental or overtime pay.
The applicant assures that all salaries and fringe benefits for D.A.R.E. officers funded through this sub-grant will be for officers presenting the D.A.R.E. curriculum in the classroom. The applicant also assures that it will notify LCLE of any D.A.R.E. officer no longer able to fulfill his/her teaching obligation as described in the application.
13. **PRESS RELEASES.** The applicant certifies that any statements or press releases describing projects, activities, or results shall name the Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement, and State D.A.R.E. Advisory Board as the entities responsible for making funds available for such activity.
14. **PROPERTY.** Property acquired under the grant will be used in the criminal justice/law enforcement system consistent with the objectives of the project funded.
15. **REPORTS.** The applicant assures that it shall submit, at such times and in such form as may be prescribed, such reports as LCLE may reasonably require, including monthly or quarterly fiscal reports, quarterly program reports, and final fiscal reports.

16. **SIGNED SUBGRANT AWARD.** The signed Statement of Sub-grant Award must be signed and returned L.C.L.E. offices within fifteen (15) days of the award being mailed to the agency. Failure to comply with this deadline will allow L.C.L.E. to reassign the funds to other D.A.R.E. agencies that have demonstrated a need for the funds.

21. **USE OF GRANT FUNDS.** Grant funds shall not be used for lobbying activities. Politically oriented materials (brochures, leaflets, films, etc.) are prohibited for payment from grant funds.

22. **WRITTEN APPROVAL OF CHANGES.** The applicant certifies that all sub-grant changes must be obtained with prior written approval from L.C.L.E. for major project changes. These include (a) changes of substance in project activities; (b) changes in the project director or key professional personnel identified in the approved application; (c) changes in the sub-grant period; and/or (d) changes in the approved budget.
