NOTICE OF A PUBLIC HEARING/COMMUNITY MEETING  
REQUEST FOR PUBLIC COMMENTS DURING 30-DAY PERIOD**

November 1, 2024

*U.S. Housing and Urban Development Program Funding*

During FY 24, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development is awarding the City of Monroe, a total of \$2,192,040.26. Of this amount, \$732,121.00 impacts Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds, \$303,883.94 impacts Home Investment Partnership Program (HOME) funds and \$1,156,035.32 impacts HOME-ARP (American Rescue Program) funds.

Local jurisdictions such as the City of Monroe must develop a five-year plan, called the Consolidated Plan, to assess the area's affordable housing and community development needs and market conditions, and to make data-driven, place-based investment decisions based on funding guidelines and funding availability to expend awarded funds.

The City of Monroe's Planning and Urban Development Department will host a public hearing/community meeting to discuss how awarded funds will be spent and to receive public comment and input. The meeting will be held on **Thursday, November 14, 2024**, beginning at [5:30PM](#) at the Public Safety Training Center on Martin Luther King in Monroe. This meeting is open to the public and all City of Monroe residents are invited to participate.
