#### LOUISIANA PURCHASE GARDENS & ZOO

This month I would like to share with you about one of the newest animals in the zoo. It is the Pere David's Deer. First I would like to tell you that it is one of the rarest deer in the world and it was saved from extinction by smuggling. By the late 19th century, the world's only herd left belonged to Tongzhi, the



Emperor of China. The herd was maintained in the Nanyuan Royal Hunting Garden in Nan Haizi, near Peking. In 1895, one of the walls of the hunting garden was destroyed by a heavy flood of the Yongding River, and most of the animals escaped and were killed and eaten by starving peasants. Fewer than thirty Père David's Deer remained in the garden. Then in 1900, during the Boxer Rebellion, the garden was occupied by troops and the remaining deer were shot and eaten, leaving the animal extinct in its native China. The animal would have been extinct from the whole world if no for the fact that a few of the deer had previously been illegally transported to Europe for exhibition and breeding. After the extirpation of the Chinese population in 1900, Herbrand Russell, 11th Duke of Bedford, was instrumental in saving the species. He acquired the few remaining animals from European zoos and nurtured a herd at Woburn Abbey. Threatened again by both World Wars, the species survived largely due to the efforts of Bedford and his son Hastings, later 12th Duke of Bedford. The current world population, now found in zoos around the world, stems from the Woburn Abbey herd. [10]

We would like to announce that our herd had a baby this year so there is one more in the world. These animals are most likely to be seen from our safari boat ride.
